# **Holiday Decoration Guidelines**

It's not too early to start thinking about holiday decorating!

Please keep in mind the guidelines established by the **Oregon State Fire Marshal** for our community setting:

- Tree Size: Live or artificial placed in resident rooms must be under 24 inches tall, including the pot or stand, and less than 9 inches in diameter.
- Lighting: Electrical decorations are not allowed on trees in resident rooms, except LED lights approved by CCP. Battery-operated lights and decorations are welcome.
- Safety Certification: Artificial trees, wreaths, and similar decorations must display a Certification Mark showing they meet safety standards. This includes the UL symbol, the words "Certified" and "Safety," a geographic identifier, and a file number.


